The complete transcription of the original 1880 United States census. Includes the enumeration of individuals within households and institutions. This allows you to view those who were neighbors of your ancestors. Approximately 50 million names are contained on the CDs. Mortality Index: United States, 1850-1880 (#164)

Mortality records, created by the Bureau of the Census during census years, document the deaths of individuals who had been recorded in the previous census. This CD indexes the Mortality Records of several states from 1850-1880. Records indexed may not be comprehensive for the time period covered. Records generally include Full name, Soundex code, Sex, State of birth, Occupation, Month of death, Age at death, Cause of death, State and county in which the individual died.

U.S. Census Index, 1607-1880, All 50 states (#310-320)

Each one of these U.S. Census Indexes includes records from many different states, so you can dig deeper and more quickly with a single search than you could with almost any other research method. There's one CD for early colonial times (1607-1789), and ten others that cover one decade each for the

County & Family Histories: Pennsylvania, 1740-1900 (#193)

With information on approximately 275,000 Pennsylvania residents and their families, this CD contains images of the pages of fourteen comprehensive books of Pennsylvania county and family histories. The information is also valuable because statewide registration of events such as births and deaths was not required in Pennsylvania prior to 1906. This CD is unique because it provides not only family histories but county histories as well. You can learn, for example, not only that your ancestor was married in Butler County in 1800 but what Butler County was like in 1800. With this information you are able to gain a more complete understanding of your ancestors and the times and locations in which they lived. Records generally include birth date, marriage date, occupation, death date, information about the county or town in which your ancestor lived. Indexed.

Family History: Mid-Atlantic Genealogies, 1340-1940 (#156)

This CD contains the searchable text of 11 volumes of Mid-Atlantic family histories. Since many of these volumes were originally published in very small quantities and for limited distribution, they may have previously been difficult to locate and research. The information in this CD concentrates on New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, and Maryland. Since the early 1600s, more immigrants have settled in or passed through the Mid-Atlantic region than any other region. Many of the family histories trace family lines back to their English, German, and Irish origins. For your convenience, this free-text CD allows you to search on any type of identifying information such as names, dates, and locations. What you'll find:

- Personal narratives and biographical sketches
- Dates of birth, baptism, marriage, and death
- Information about education, disposition, occupation, and physical characteristics
- Images of the pages of eleven volumes published by the Genealogical Publishing Company

Books Included

Genealogical Record of the Condit Family Descendants of John Cunditt, a Native of Great Britain who Settled in Newark, N.J., by Jotham H. Condit and Eben Condit. This record of John Cunditt's descendants lists over 3500 names.

Capt. Mathew Dill and Mary of Monaghan Settlement and Descendants, by Rosalie Jones Dill. This book chronicles the history of the descendants of Mathew Dill born in 1698 in Ireland. Extensive historical information is presented about the family including personal narratives, court records, and timeline analysis.

Tristram Dodge and his Descendants in America, by Robert Dodge. A comprehensive, historical and descriptive accounting of Block Island and Cow Neck, Long Island, the original 17th and 18th

century settlements of Tristram Dodge and his descendants. The author discusses events with a contextual emphasis of the environmental conditions of early New England.

The Dolman Compendium, by Paul H. Dolman. This family history traces the Dolman family from England to America and covers from 1253 to the mid-1900s. The book has hundreds of names listed.

A Collection of Family Records with Biographical Sketches Bearing Name Douglas, by Charles Henry James Douglas. This book is a collection of family records with biographical sketches, and other memoranda of various families and individuals bearing the name Douglas or allied to families of that name, including the ancient Douglas Family of Scotland, the New London Family, the New Fairfield Family and other New Jersey families. Within the 500-page manuscript are genealogical records as well as detailed discussions of the origin and meaning of the family name, the coat of arms, and many poignant historical anecdotes.

Genealogy of the Dutton Family of Pennsylvania, by Gilbert Cope. This is a comprehensive study of the Dutton Family in the United States from the 17th century and onward; it is preceded by a history of the family in England for the time of William the Conqueror to the year 1669 and an appendix containing an account of the Duttons of Connecticut.

By the Name of Emerich, Emerick, Emmerich, Emrich, and Emrick, by Kenneth D. Haines. Starting from the early 1700s, this volume lists 3,000 names in eleven generations and includes information on birth dates, marriages, and death dates.

The Emmons Family, by Edward N. Emmons. This record of the emigrant Thomas Emmons of Newport, Rhode Island lists approximately 3,500 descendants and dates from 1639 to 1905. The Emmons surname originated in England and this family history could include information on the following surnames: Emun, Emans, Emins, Emyn, and others.

Stephen Banks Leonard, by William A. Leonard. This book details the lives of Stephen Banks Leonard and his descendants of Owego, Tioga County, and New York. It includes interesting stories and letters written by Stephen.

The Descendants of Adam Mott of Hempstead, Long Island, N.Y., by E. Doubleday Harris. Originated from Hempstead, Long Island, New York, this family history references approximately 200 names.

The Schell Family, by Christian Denissen. This book contains descendants of John Christian Schell and John Schell originating in Baden, Germany. It includes detailed information from generation to generation.

Family History: New England Families #1, 1600s-1800s (#117)

An excellent resource for anyone who has ancestors from New England, this Family Archive CD contains family histories from all around New England rather than from just one state. The CD contains images of the pages of 13 books covering family histories and genealogies. The books reference approximately 140,000 names. Some of the individuals included may not have lived in New England in this time period, but were mentioned in the genealogy of someone who did. Records generally include individual's name, residence, family links, and dates of family events. Indexed.

Family History: Southern Biographies & Genealogies, 1500s-1940s (#500)

This CD contains the electronically searchable text of the pages of twelve books detailing the origin and descent of various prominent Southern Families. Many of these volumes were previously published in very small quantities and for limited distribution and were difficult to locate. Information in these volumes date from the pre-1500s to the 1940s and contain narrative lineage records extending from a family's earliest-known immigrant ancestor. The family histories span several generations and include information from both public record and private correspondence. Since the information contained within these family histories is narrative, you can often gain quite a complete understanding of your ancestor's lives and the times in which they lived.

Local & Family Histories: New England, 1600s-1900s (#449)

This CD contains the text of twenty comprehensive volumes of New England local and family histories. In all, the volumes contain information on more than 50,000 New England residents and their families. Unique because it includes not only family histories but local and town histories as well, this CD provides a detailed account of life in early New England. The town histories were compiled from public record as well as private correspondence, and they cover a broad range of topics from education and religion to early settlement and major industry. While the information covers all parts of New England, some of the books focus specifically on Connecticut, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island. Records generally contain birth date, marriage date, occupation, and death date. Many volumes include more detailed information such as a description of property owned, information about an individual's will, and notable personal characteristics and features.

World Family Tree, vol.1-5 (#701-705)

This 5-CD bundle contains approximately 8000 actual family trees contributed by family history enthusiasts. Approximately 6.3 million individuals are named, complete with dates of important family events and links to other family members (where known). Some records contain additional source notes and biographical information. These CDs exclude information about living individuals except for their name, gender, and family links.

World Family Tree European Origins, vol. E1 (#802)

This CD features nearly 1,000 actual family trees and provides the extra benefit of allowing you to target your search in the World Family Tree to trees that have a high concentration of European-born ancestors. The trees on this CD have been selected from World Family Tree Volumes 1-12. Over 1.3 million individuals are named, complete with event dates and family links where known. A significant portion of the individuals in each tree have event locations from England, Germany, Austria, France, Italy and/or other European countries. Some records contain additional source notes and biographical information. This CD excludes information about living individuals except for their name, gender, and family links. All pedigrees can be exported as GEDCOM files. Information contains Trees dating from pre-1600 to present, Many royal lines and nobility of Europe, Trees containing first and last names, dates of birth, marriage, and death, and names and relationships of family members.

IMMIGRATION & PASSENGER LISTS

Passenger & Immigration Lists: Boston, 1821-1850 (#256)

This data set contains alphabetical listings of approximately 161,000 individuals who arrived at the port of Boston from foreign ports between 1821 and 1850 taken from microfilm rolls of passenger lists from the National Archives. For each individual listed here, you will find the following information:

- Age
- Gender
- Arrival date in Boston
- Country of origin
- Occupation
- Name of the ship on which the individual sailed (available in approximately 20% of records)
- National Archives microfilm roll on which you may wish to research further or verify the information included here

Passenger & Immigration Lists Index, 1538-1940 (1999)

This CD contains listings of approximately 2,750,000 individuals who arrived in United States ports between 1538 and 1940. Originally compiled by P. William Filby, these records can provide valuable family history information to those with immigrant ancestors. This information was collected from published passenger lists, naturalization records, church records, family and local histories, as well as voter and land registrations, and is the most complete source of immigration information available on CD, especially for the early years of this time period.

For each individual listed, you will find the following information: name and age of immigrant; year and place of immigration; names of family members with whom they traveled; full source information; and source code of immigration record. Depending on the original source, you may also learn the name of the ship on which the individual arrived, ports and dates of departure and arrival, occupation, religion, places of origin and residence, and naturalization date. Indexed.

Passenger & Immigration Lists: Germans to America, 1875-1888

The first fully searchable version of this invaluable resource, this CD contains information on approximately 1.5 million immigrants who arrived in the United States between 1875 and 1888. Edited by Ira A. Glazier and P. William Filby, and published by Scholarly Resources, Inc., the print version of *Germans to America* was the first extensive indexed reference devoted to German surname immigrants to the United States.

This Family Archive contains the information taken from Volumes 32 through 56 of the *Germans to America* series. An important feature of this series is that it includes individuals of German ancestry who emigrated not only from German states or territories but also from other countries such as France, Switzerland, and Luxembourg. Also, it covers the high point of German immigration to America (the years 1880 through 1885); during that period 797,900 Germans immigrated to America. For each individual listed, you can find the following information: immigrant's name, age, gender, occupation, village or town of origin, destination in the U.S., date of arrival, dates and means of travel, name of the ship on which the person traveled. In addition, you may learn the individual's port of embarkation and debarkation and the name of the ship's Captain. This CD also provides an introduction on the history of German migration to the United States to put your family's heritage in historical context.

Land Records: AL, AR, FL, LA, MI, MN, OH, WI, 1790-1907 (#255)

This CD contains approximately 1,645,000 records from the U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Land Management (BLM). The records are often the only available source offering the identification of legal land descriptions and transfer of property ownership from the U.S. Government to private land owners. They show who obtained what land from the Federal Government, and when it was obtained. Source documents include homesteads, cash sales, warrants, private land claims, swamp lists, state selections, and railroad lists. Records included may not be comprehensive for the time and region covered. Information generally includes Patentee's name and Soundex code, state, Accession number (directly relates a document image to the original hard copy document), Document number (used to order a copy of the original record from the BLM), Date the deed was signed, Land office that handled the transaction (see our list of land offices), Aliquot part reference, Section Number, Block, Township, Range, and Meridian/ Survey Area, Number of acres, Act/Treaty authorizing sale.

MILITARY RECORDS

Military Records: Confederate Soldiers, 1861-1865 (#119)

This CD contains the complete contents of National Archives microfilm roll number M918, Register of Confederate Soldiers, Sailors, and Citizens Who Died in Federal Prisons and Military Hospitals in the North 1861-1865. The collection includes the names of approximately 25,000 individuals which are indexed for convenience and easy searching. After the Civil War, federal law did not provide for the burial or marking of graves for Confederate soldiers who died in the North. At the turn of the century, however, Confederate veterans' groups convinced the government to pass a statute that provided for the appropriate marking of these graves. As part of the project, the government compiled the 665 page register that is now on this CD. Records generally include individual's first and last name, Rank, Company, Regiment, Death date, Location of death or burial, Number and locality of the grave.

Military Records: Massachusetts Civil War Soldiers & Sailors, 1861-1865 (#134)

This CD contains images of the pages from all nine volumes of Massachusetts Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines in the Civil War. The materials date from 1861 to 1865 and follow the military careers of Massachusetts servicemen and their commanding officers. Together, the military records in these volumes reference approximately 140,000 individuals nearly all men who served in Massachusetts units during the Civil War. Information was obtained from the following sources: original enlistment papers, muster-in rolls, descriptive rolls, town reports, casualty lists, monthly reports, hospital records, muster-out reports, and miscellaneous papers. Generally, the records include each individual's name, military rank, regiment, discharge status, date of death (if it occurred during enlistment), and the names of commanding officers. Also, this CD provides a brief history of each individual's military career. Indexed.

Military Records: U.S. Soldiers, 1784-1811 (#146)

This CD contains electronically-reproduced images of a card index that originally spanned nine rolls of National Archives microfilm. This card index is the index to the compiled service records of 21,000 volunteer soldiers who served from 22 states and territories of the United States between 1784 and 1811. For your searching convenience, an electronic name index is provided that spans the information from all nine rolls of microfilm.

You may also be able to learn the full names of the bride and groom, their birth dates, the year and/or month they were married, and the marriage location. Indexed.

U.S. Marriage Index, 1718-1981, 38 states (#001-006,225-229,400)

These marriage indexes are very popular because you can instantly search them for entire states, or even entire regions of the country. Also, marriage indexes are often one of the few sources of information about female ancestors, since women were not routinely noted by the U.S. census prior to 1850. This collection indexes 3,185,000 records. Information provided includes names of both spouses, date of marriage, and the county and state where the marriage took place.

#001. Family Tree Maker® Marriage Index: Selected Counties of Louisiana, 1718-1925 contains indexes to approximately 285,000 marriage records from 58 selected parishes (counties) in Louisiana. Records begin as early as 1718 in St. Helens Parish. There are no records for any parishes for the years 1719-1727 and 1729-1733. After 1734, there is a general increase in records throughout the state. Most of these records were compiled from courthouse marriage records. For pre-1850 marriages, it is better to use CD-0227, because it is more comprehensive for that time period and includes everything available on CD-0001.

#002. Family Tree Maker® Marriage Index: Selected Counties of Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Ohio, and Tennessee, 1720-1926 contains indexes to marriage records for selected years from 221 selected counties in five states: Illinois (19), Indiana (51), Kentucky (67), Ohio (39), and Tennessee (45).

With this information, you may wish to request a copy of an individual's application for a Social Security Card. Ordinarily, this application contains the person's full name, date and place of birth, and both parents' names, including the mother's maiden name. The information compiled here is current through November 1998.

217 Genealogy Books (#113)

This CD contains the full text (without illustrations) from 217 books divided into subjects. All sources have been preserved as originally published. The wide coverage of the CD emphasizes New England and the Eastern seaboard.
