This brought much laughter from the wives that watched.

The Patton Museum had a special exhibit on Elvis Presley and covered his period when he served in the Army.

The memorial service was held at our monument just outside the Patton Museum.

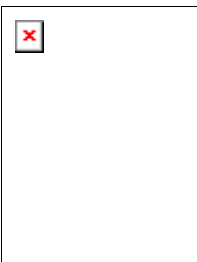
There were more than 200 in attendance to listen to Chaplain Dennis Roe's remarks. A soldier from Fort Knox placed a wreath and another played Taps to end the ceremony.

On Friday evening many attended the Derby Dinner Playhouse for a great show and meal.

Saturday morning was the business meeting. There was a large turnout for the meeting. The minutes are published in this newsletter but some highlights include the selection of Kansas City, Missouri as our reunion site in 2006. Allen "KC" Allcock, D Troop, 69-70, will be the host. Exact dates and details will be published in future newsletters and on our web. 25th Infantry Division Association president, Dave Garrod, was present and gave an overview of the Association, status of the division, which has units in Iraq and Afghanistan, future reunions, and visits to our wounded soldiers that are at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. Also present, was Dave Nelson, chairman of the 25th IDA Scholarship Program. Dave gave the status of the scholarship program and announced that two children of $\frac{3}{4}$ CAV veterans received \$1000 each this year. They were Fayth Aronson, daughter of Bill Aronson and Shellie Bronis, daughter of Joe Bronis. The traditional "passing of the hat" raised \$1,476 for the scholarship fund, thus assuring at least one $\frac{3}{4}$ CAV youngster will receive a \$1,000 scholarship in 2005.

Following the business meeting tours went to Churchill Downs and to the Louisville Slugger Museum.

Our banquet was Saturday evening. MG Terry Tucker, commanding General of Fort Knox was our speaker. During General Tucker's speech he covered the history of the $\frac{3}{4}$ CAV and mentioned many former troopers by name. He also discussed how today's Cavalrymen and Tankers are being trained to be ready to go directly to their unit and be ready to fight; how the force is changing, smaller battalions and brigades, configured more like the $\frac{3}{4}$ CAV, as a combined arms team. Following his speech, General Tucker was presented a signed copy of "100 Miles of Bad Road". General Tucker then told us that he had read "100 Mile..." a number of times and in a previous assignment had walked the areas in Vietnam where we had fought.

Art Bonevich, A Troop, 63-66, has been sending packages since the squadron deployed. He uses a priority mailbox # 4 (7x7x6, 0 Box #4) and fills it with goodies. Cost is around \$6.00 to mail and takes about a week to get there.

COMMENTS FROM THE SQUADRON COMMANDER

Below are some excerpts from an email received from LTC Mike McMahon, commander of the 3rd Squadron, 4th U.S. Cavalry.

"We have nearly 400 assigned or attached to the squadron. All at Khandahar, although, like the last 2 weeks has been, full of patrols away from the base... the food is excellent, we have a roof, and the time is moving along quickly.. Cav is doing very well. We've flown and driven a massive amount of hours and miles. Some vehicles have been in the unit now for one month with more than 2,000 miles. The aircraft have also been performing beyond expectations.... The soldiers; always a proud moment for me to express the depth of motivation of each and every one of these guys and gals, they are terrific and accomplish more than I can articulate in one setting."

DONATIONS NEEDED FOR STETSONS

The Chapter will be making a donation to our squadron the assist deserving PVTs and PFCs in the purchase of Cavalry Stetsons. The 1SGTs are in the process of identifying the troopers. The cost of the Stetsons is \$82.45 each. The trooper will pay \$40.00 and the Chapter will pick up the difference of \$42.45. The cost includes shipping and the cord that goes around the brim.

The "Cavalry Hat" is worn at ceremonies and special events. The Cav hat had its beginnings during the Vietnam War. The tradition is believed to have been originated in early 1964 by LTC John B. Stockton (Commander of 3/17 Cavalry) at Ft. Benning, Georgia. The hat was adopted in an effort to increase esprit de corps in the new air cavalry squadron and was meant to emulate the look of the 1876 pattern campaign hat worn by cavalry

troopers long ago. Once units deployed to Vietnam, the custom slowly spread to other air cavalry units, and by the cessation of hostilities, virtually all air cav, and some ground cav units, had adopted the Cav hat.

While unit commanders did not mandate the wearing of the hats, there was considerable peer pressure to conform, and most troopers quickly added the Cav hat to their wardrobes.

The 8th meeting of the 3/4 CAV Chapter, 25th Infantry Division Association was called to order at 9:00 AM, 7 Sep 2002 at the Holiday Inn in Clarksville, IN by Chapter President Jerry Headley.

Introduction of officers:

Chaplain Roe opened the meeting with prayer.

Jerry Headley followed with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Admin Announcements: Members reminded of tours and to be upstairs no later than 11:15. Buses will depart at 11:30 sharp.

Discussion of how the meeting runs.

Reminded that the hospitality room is a No Smoking Room and we are to honor that as some folks have breathing and or health problems. Times given for the closing of the hospitality room. Reminded that you could still sign up for the seating at the banquet dinner and to bring your meal ticket. Photographer will be taking group photos before the banquet. This is one of the largest reunions yet, 344 people attending this year of which 186 are Cav. Members. Charlie Troop had the most in attendance with 46 Troopers. 46 states were represented. Russell Mattison, D Troop, 67-69 traveled the farthest coming from Soldotna, Alaska.

Bob Tegelman from Wisconsin works for Weyhauser and they donated enough paper for about the next 8 newsletters.

Dave Garrod-25th Inf Div Assoc. President.

He gave recognition to Jerry Headley for all his work in the 25th IDA.

He encouraged people to join the Association because 1) Tropic Lightning Flashes newsletter, 2) eligibility for scholarships, 3) Reunions (Tucson this year, Pittsburg in 2005, and Schofield Barracks, Hawaii in 2006. Usually first of Oct., 4) great way to meet the guys .If you can't make any other reunions-make the Hawaii one as that is the great one.

Motion to enter into the minutes to recognize Ed Kayler for his years of dedicated service to the chapter.

Introduction of David Nelson: One of the Directors of the Div. Assoc., Chairman of Scholarship Committee.

Norman Veron, 84 years old father of Murray Veron, KIA 31 Jan, 1968, recognized.

Minutes: The minutes of the 2002 reunion had been provided previously in the newsletter and handouts made available prior to the meeting.. Motion made by Dave Nelson to accept minutes as published. 2nd by Doug hanna. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Bobby Bingham gave the report. Balance of the checking account as of May 2004 statement \$29, 933.41. This includes monies paid for reunion. All bills have not been paid but will be following settlement after the reunion. We have one CD valued at \$14,611.60. We had had three CDs previously but all were merged to get a better interest rate. Total balance is \$44,544.81 as of today, 26 June 2004. Largest expenditures are the newsletter which is approximately \$800 a quarter, depending on number of pages, which we try to hold to no more than eight. Postage ,excluding the newsletter, runs \$400 annually. Much of this is for returned postage for those of you who move but do not provide us a change of address. Quartermaster Store,. This is pretty much a wash as we try to keep the prices low so members can buy the goods.

Motion to accept the report by Les Stafford, 2nd by Dave Nelson. Motion passed.

Membership: President Headley discussed membership. We have 258 lifetime members, 66 annual members, 1,072 troopers on our mailing list. This means 324 members are carrying the expenses of 748 members. Dues are needed to pay for the costs of the newsletters. Dues are 10.00 annually or \$75.00 life. You must also be a member of the 25th Inf. Division Association. Reminded to please pay dues to Bingo or other officer and get your current membership card. Mr. Regul stated that he had not received his membership card. He later realized that he did have it and thought there was another card due.

Newsletter/Web: Stanley "SKI" Homiski is the new editor and webmaster. SKI asks that anyone having suggestions for the web page or newsletter to please contact him. We can always use stories for the newsletter. Send the information to Jerry, as he writes the news letter and Ski publishes it. The web page is www.3-4cav.com. We have the newsletter on the web page. It will stay on the web site until it is replaced by the latest newsletter.

Scholarship: David Nelson informed us that we give \$1000 annually to the 25th Inf. Div. Assoc. for the scholarship fund. You must be a member for at least one year to qualify. Children and Grandchildren are eligible to include step-children. You should consider leaving money in your wills to the fund. Last year during the 25th IDA mid -year meeting ,2nd, 3rd, and 4th year students are now eligible as well as 1st year students. Priority is given to 1st year students, however and based on the availability of funds.

Jerry Headley listed past and present $\frac{3}{4}$ CAV children scholarship winners. Two winners in 2003: Nick Parisi, Steve Sloan. 2004 winners: Fayth Aronson, Shelli Bronis. A hat was passed for donations to the scholarship fund and \$1,476 was raised. Bobby Hollis usually passes the hat but he is in Germany. Two recent graduates benefiting from the scholarship fund are Dennis Roes daughter, and Roger McGill's son.

Chapter Projects: President Headley presented a list of 13 projects that the chapter had accomplished since the last reunion. Attended the $\frac{3}{4}$ Cavalry Change of Command ceremony. Attended Tropic Lightning Day. Rededicated Vietnam KIA plaque at squadron. Attended 25th IN Div. Deployment Ceremony. FAM tour in Northern KY. Attended 25th Div Assoc. Reunion. Quarterly newsletter. Reunion planning. Veterans and Memorial Day at the Wall. WW II Memorial dedication. John Hollern's funeral.

New Business: Site proposals for 2006 reunion. Allen "KC" Allcock presented Kansas City, MO. President Headley

Les Stafford started a short discussion on the merits of having a reunion west of the Mississippi River.

.Carl Quickmire gave an analysis of the geographic distribution of $\frac{3}{4}$ Cav. Chapter members. 16% in the N.E. 28% in the Midwest, 36% in the Southeast, and 24% West of the Mississippi River. Based on attendance at this years reunion and expected growth of the Chapter future facilities need to be able to accommodate a minimum of 400 people for the Saturday Night Banquet. 68 percent of this years attendees were within a 500 mile or one day drive..

A vote by hand was conducted and Kansas City, MO won with 70% of the votes. The 2006 reunion dates will be published in a future newsletter.

1st Time attendees were asked to stand and be recognized.

There being no further business a Motion to Adjourn by David Nelson, seconded by numerous. Motion was passed unanimously.

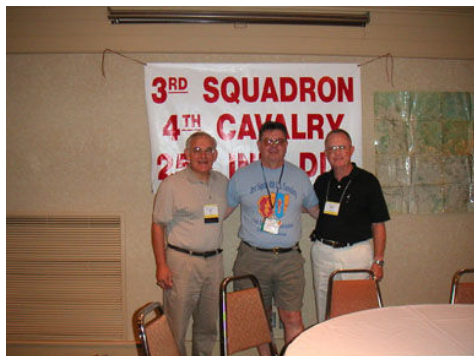

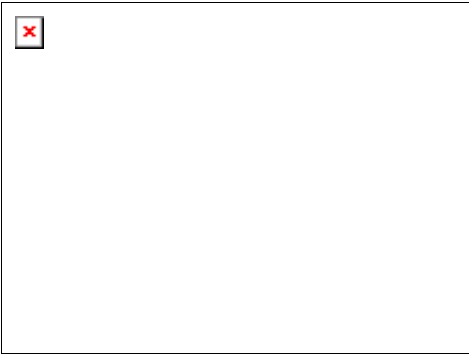

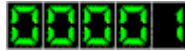
