Dear Teachers:

Your students who have recently completed the MMTA Student Achievement Testing should have the results of these tests filed in their school records.

The parents of your students should be urged to take a copy of the MMTA rating sheet that gives the judge's comments and the scores, along with a copy of the MMTA Certificate of Achievement to the student's school. Parents are entitled to have information placed in the student's CA-60 file, a cumulative file containing academic and non-academic information for each student K-12. High school students can request that this information be placed in their portfolio. This privilege was granted to high school students by bill #4572 passed by the Michigan legislature.

For the convenience of the parents and students, the MMTA teacher can provide a copy of the MMTA information so the student may be able to retain the original.

Michigan teachers and students are fortunate to have procedures and legislation that permit gaining recognition in the schools of MMTA Student Achievement Testing. This kind of recognition gives a positive significance to the learning experience and incentive for further music study.
