

TROOP 150 COMMUNICATIONS / INFORMATION METHODS

TROOP WEBPAGE: The troop webpage is growing with info! You can find troop calendars, activity information (including EATS Forms), and activity planning aids on the webpage. If you are new to the troop we have a New Scout Info link with lots of helpful info to get started in the troop. You can also catch the latest news from the Scoutmaster in his Scoutmaster Update, and the troop Historian in his Troop Newsletter. With the Members Only user name and password you can also find the troop roster, troop and patrol leadership info, advancement info, and much more. Once you are a member of the troop see the Scoutmaster or the Troop Committee Chair for the login and password.

SCOUT: Your son should be a major source of information. If he is not, then now is the time to start asking him to pay more attention to announcements of upcoming activities – and to share with you! Take time to talk with your son about upcoming activities to show that his listening and gathering of this information is important.

PATROL LEADER: Your son may know the name of an upcoming activity but he may not have all the details. Have you son call his Patrol Leader for details he missed. A list of the troop's Patrol Leaders can be found on the webpage under the Members Only section.

PATROL MENTOR: If the Patrol Leader does not have the information please call your Patrol Mentor. A list of the Patrol Mentors can also be found on the webpage under the Members Only section.

SCOUTMASTER: Your Scoutmaster is always available to talk with you. However, if you are going straight to the Scoutmaster with all your questions you are bypassing a whole bunch of people that are there to help you and take some of the load off our Scoutmaster. Please call your Patrol Leader or Patrol Mentor when appropriate before calling your Scoutmaster.

TROOP COMMITTEE CHAIR: Your Troop Committee Chair is there to ensure the resources are there to make the Program happen. (Remember that the Scoutmasters are responsible for the boys and the program. The Committee is there to support the Scoutmasters and the Scouts.) Most of your questions should be directed to your Patrol Mentor.
