OBITUARY**NEVIN BROWN, 90, KIWANIS MEMBER FOR 50 YEARS**

A memorial service will be held for Nevin Brown, friend of many, and longtime Kiwanis member, at 3:PM Sunday September 10 at the Chatham United Methodist Church. He died Friday, August 18, at the Morris View nursing home. He was 90 years old.

Nevin was born in Bethlehem, PA, and lived in Chatham since 1945. He was an Army veteran of World War II. and a member of our Kiwanis Club for 50 years. He was well known in the Chatham school system as a teacher and assistant superintendent. He is survived by his wife, Mavis Mote Brown, two sons, a daughter, a brother, eight grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren.

He took much pride in the Kiwanis-related achievements of his grandson, Troy Dibley, who was a Trustee of Key Club International while attending Chatham High School. Then, while attending George Washington University, he was elected President of Circle K International.

At the 50th Circle K convention in Greensboro, NC, Nancy Boucher and Mark Litwack presented Troy with the Carrington Swain Recognition Award for the New Jersey Foundation. This award recognizes the memories of William Carrington and Charles Swain, the only members of the New Jersey district who have served as President of Kiwanis International.
