Washing Instructions

Traditional college method: Splash through mud puddles and accidentally leave it out in the rain. Hang it out of your window to dry.

If you *really* want to wash it, here is the method recommended by the yarn maker:

- Wash by hand in skin-temperature water, with gentle hand or dishwashing soap (even shampoo will work).
- Rinse completely and roll in a towel to remove as much water as possible.
- Dry flat.

Machine Wash, Gentle:

- Machine wash in gentle cycle, or wash by hand in the sink with gentle soap (even shampoo) and skin-temperature water.
- Rinse completely and roll in a towel to remove as much water as possible.
- Dry flat.
