Finger play: The following is an explanation of the brief instructions which appear above the music:

Climbing motion—Start with the tip of the right forefinger against the tip of the left thumb. Then touch the left forefinger to right thumb and continue in this way, imitating a climbing motion.

Rain motion—Bring hands up and down, wiggling fingers to give the feeling of rain.

Shaking hands—Bring hands up, palms upward, freely shaking hands at wrists.

Climbing motion—Repeat climbing motion described above.



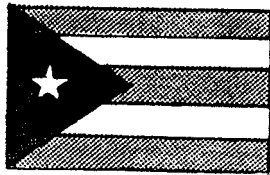

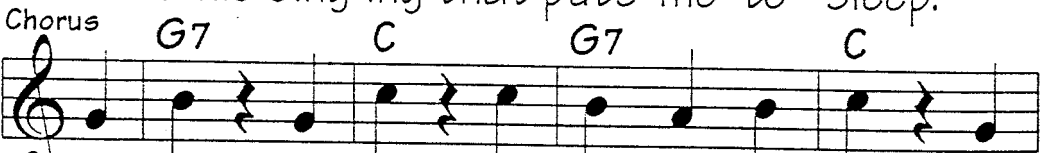

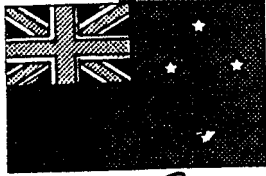
