Summary of Business Meeting—Sunday February 26, 2005

We had approximately **30 people** at our first ever club-wide business meeting. It was extraordinarily productive. One of the most important decisions made was to **cut our costs by phasing to an all email distribution of the meeting announcements** and flyers. This will allow us to afford to pay for the space at the National Heritage Museum, which has been such a wonderful home for our club for the past several years. We will be working toward getting everyone on an email distribution list which is available to all for posting. **Ralph Johnston and Eric Goldstein** will be working on this project. If anyone knows a club member without access to email, please help them stay informed. We will be creating some kind of system for letting those people know about the meetings.

Lew Regelman has agreed to become club treasurer. We decided to attempt to meet our financial needs by creating a "**suggested donation**" of **\$5 at the door**. We will have a greeter to encourage this at future meetings. We also want to continue to strongly encourage auction donations, it's a major funding source for the club. We also agreed to suggest an appropriate voluntary membership contribution for those who can afford to support the club above and beyond these contributions...

Tony Mazzola and Julie Steinhilber will be continuing to produce our flyers, but they will be distributed as pdfs, as well as being **posted online** so others can download and poster them around.

Jan Burandt agreed to stay on as Program Director, if assisted.

Michael Halle volunteered to help with program direction and **Bill Salkin** also agreed to assist in coordinating programming and to be a technical facilitator for meetings. Several volunteers stepped forward offering projection services and silver screens. **Jim McDonough, Peter Weiler, Jim McCreary, Bill Salkin, Ralph Johnston, Ed Jameson, Eric Goldstein and Ken Kaiser** all volunteered analogue and digital projection, sound, screens, etc for future use, and that more resources may be needed so please let us know what you have and what you are willing to offer the use of.

We decided to keep our organization informal for now, however it was agreed that everyone with a position in the club, needs to be backed up by an alternate, whom they would be responsible for staying in contact with. A list of duties or titles will be developed and when people have questions regarding the club, they should consult this list and contact the appropriate person with their questions.

Jim McDonough brought up the importance of the workshop aspect of our club and how we need to be a resource for people wanting to learn about 3D imaging. With this in mind, next year we have scheduled **3 of our 4 meetings in the Farr Conference Center** (Flag Room) which is perfect for mingling and workshops and is also a fine place for projecting shows, (remember Ellis Island?).

Several people expressed an interest in an increased number of meetings and outreach. It was agreed that we would maintain our **4 meetings at the National Heritage Museum** and encourage members to organize outings of various sorts. Several people brought up ideas for field trips, shooting excursions, etc. In April, I announced an Indian Dinner outing and took several reservations for same. Several others had the same idea of organizing independent events, and the group email distribution will facilitate anyone who wishes to do something of this nature in the future. The hard work of all who have contributed to the success of the club was acknowledged by all. Clearly, there is still work to do, but we made great headway and I expect that this will be another memorable year at NHM.

Directions to Meeting:

From Rt. 128/95: Take exit 30A, also known as Marrett Road). This exit will take you to 2A East. The Museum is located approximately 3 miles from this exit. The Museum is located on your left, with a brick entrance and large iron gates.

From Rt. 495 S: Take Rt 128/95 North to exit 30A, and follow directions above.

From Rt. 495 N: Take Rt 93 South to Rte 128/95 South to exit 30A, and follow directions above.

From Rt. 2: Take Waltham Street exit (says "To Lexington Center"). At lights, take a right onto 2A. Museum will be on your left.
