## The Christian's Armor: Part 7 - Prayer

"A man is what he is on his knees before God, and nothing more." (Robert Murray M'Cheyne)

- The saint is here commanded to wield his ultimate weapon - \_\_\_\_\_. It is this piece of our Christian armor that is to be used to put on all others.

### Directives for Prayer:

- 1) At all times – literally in " \_\_\_\_\_ " of our daily lives. (vs. 18a)  
(I Thess. 5:17; Acts 2:42, Acts 4:23-31)

"To pray at all times is to live in continual God consciousness, where everything we see and experience becomes a kind of prayer, lived in deep awareness of and surrender to our heavenly Father." (John MacArthur, Jr.)

- 2) Pray in the Spirit. (vs. 18a) It is to pray with the Spirit's \_\_\_\_\_, under His \_\_\_\_\_, and in a conscious state to being \_\_\_\_\_ by Him. Prayer is a search to align our \_\_\_\_\_ with that of the \_\_\_\_\_. (Romans 8:26-27)

- Finally in vs. 19-20 Paul asks for prayer for himself. Does it seem odd that Paul would pray for words, boldness, and faith. He holds himself up as an example to us. We are not as great as the apostle Paul, so do we need any less prayer than he?
