Times will be as follows:

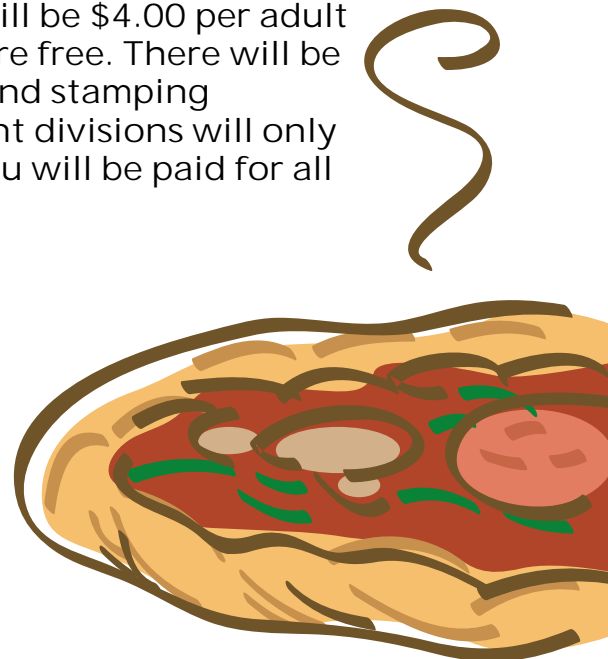

Commerce Bank vs One Stop Audio

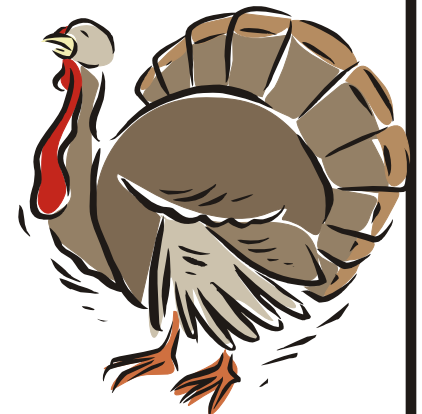

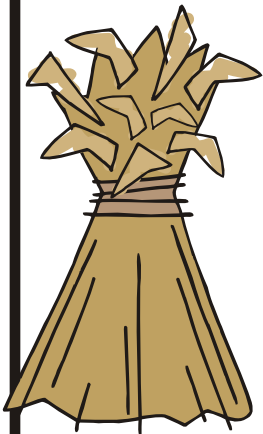
