No player should be in the same position for an entire game (going from left wing to right wing doesn't count). Finally, no player is allowed to play more than 1 full period more than another player. Each coach was provided with a complete set of these guidelines and if anyone believes a team is not adhering to the rules, you should forward your concerns in writing to any Board member.

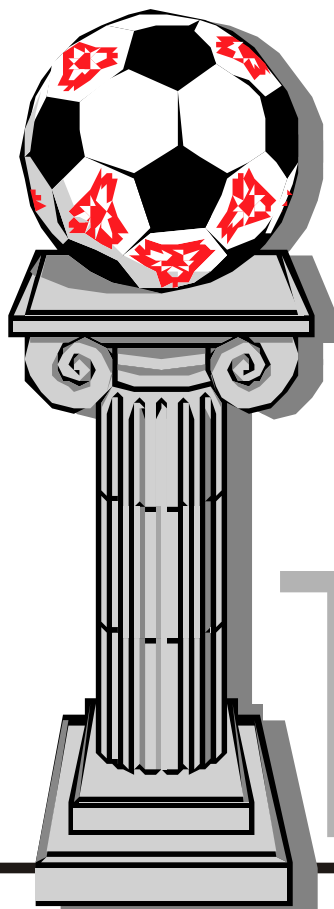

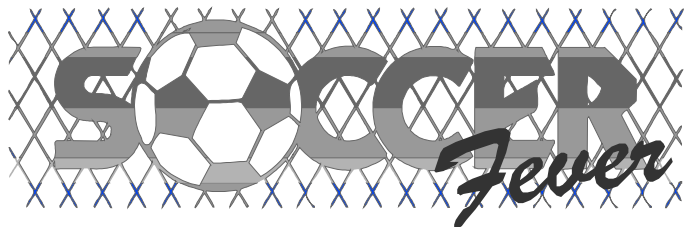
