International Communications Research recently reported that 86 percent of those surveyed prefer the mails for bills, payments, bank statements and financial reports; 10 percent opted for e-mail. About 70 percent prefer mail for product announcements and offers, even from companies whose products they have never bought; 18 percent prefer e-mail. 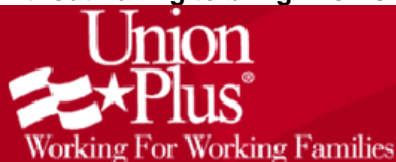
NOTICE CONCERNING CONTRIBUTIONS:

TECHNOLOGY AIDS EMPLOYEES

The U.S. Postal Service — one of the nation's largest employers of people who are deaf or hard-of-hearing — is offering new technology to allow its employees to better communicate with each other. Two types of video interpreting services are being installed at postal facilities across the country, allowing approximately 4,000 postal employees who are deaf or hard-of-hearing to communicate with supervisors, co-workers and others in real-time without having to bring in on-site interpreters or rely on text-based telephone systems.
