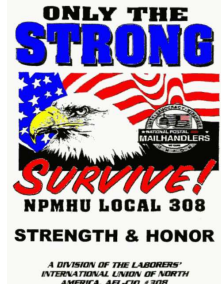
Text of Postal Reform Bill H.R. 6407

SEC. 901. TEMPORARY DISABILITY; CONTINUATION OF PAY.

(a) TIME OF ACCRUAL OF RIGHT- Section 8117 of title 5, United States code, is amended—(1) by striking ‘An employee’ and inserting ‘(a) An employee other than a Postal Service employee’; and

(2) by adding at the end the following:

(b) A Postal Service employee is not entitled to compensation or continuation of pay for the first 3 days of temporary disability, except as provided under paragraph (3) of subsection (a). A Postal Service employee may use annual leave, sick leave, or leave without pay during that 3-day period, except that if the disability exceeds 14 days or is followed by permanent disability, the employee may have their sick leave or annual leave reinstated or receive pay for the time spent on leave without pay under this section.’.

Former President Gerald R. Ford dies at 93

In 1975, then President Gerald Ford made the dedication of the Philadelphia Bulk Mail Center to public service. The plaque is visible in the foyer, to the right of the entrance. Ford was House minority leader when President Nixon chose him to replace Spiro Agnew, who resigned, as vice president in 1973. Ford became President on Aug. 9, 1974, when Nixon resigned amid the Watergate scandal.
