October 10, 2009**

Attendance

Board Members: President elect Steve Tacopina, Vice President elect Ulla Jurrissen, Secretary Jean Hallstone, and Trustees, both elect, George Crozer, and Dan Demers, and Past President Les Regenbogen.

Committee Chairs: Show Chair, Jean Hallstone, and Membership Chair Ovid Slavin

Opening

Steve called the meeting to order at 10:20 a.m. Les made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2009 meeting, as amended, George seconded the motion and it passed. Jean corrected the amount collected from Jai's Cornstarch Flowers as \$300.00 and not \$175.00 as previously stated in the original minutes.

President: Steve Tacopina took the reins in his new role as president by welcoming two new members to the board, George Crozer and Dan Demers. He also re iterated the mission and vision he spelled out in the October newsletter as "Growth", concentrating in the areas of membership, income generation, conservation awareness and community outreach. Other issues covered included the following:

- The goal was established to review and update the Bylaws and the Handbook.
- Conflict of Interest statements were collected from all board members except, Steve, Daryl, Scott and George Newman.
- Find replacement for Risk Management, and Membership. Ovid Slavin resigned as Membership chair but will stay on until a replacement can be found. Dan Demers volunteered to help Ovid with these duties in the meantime.
- Discussion ensued regarding an issue raised recently about keeping NHOS financial records secure. The new laptop computer with QuickBooks program is password protected and the records are backed up on a flash drive.
- Prompted by the passage of the amended budget at last month's meeting, Les made a motion to purchase AQ Plus Awards software and install it on the NHOS laptop with the password-protected financial data. Dan seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. A line item shall be added to the budget 2009-2010 for orchid judging software program expense in the amount of \$50.00.

Vice President: Ulla Jurrissen will continue to distribute the Auction questionnaire. She also reports the upcoming shows are MOS, Oct. 30 – Nov. 1. OSOC, Nov. 22 -22 and Nutmeg State OS, Oct. 25 in West Hartford, CN.

Treasurer: Repeat, Scott's new e-mail address is nhostreasurer@gmail.com . Although absent today, Scott submitted his report via e-mail.

- Receivables for September, including auction totaled \$4,848.00 dollars.
- Mail Call list attached.
- Expense Manifest totaling \$1,293.72 dollars Les made a motion to approve the expense manifest amended to add \$132.76 dollars for October newsletter, George seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Secretary: Jean Hallstone distributed the mail. Other issues included the following:

- Over the course of the past twelve weeks, Jean conducted an audit of the minutes in the printed NHOS records (in binders) and the same records contained in computer files for the years 2001 – 2005, in order to determine what files were missing and recover those files if possible. Minutes missing from the printed records and found in the computer files were printed and inserted in the appropriate area in the binder for that year. Minutes

missing from the computerized records that were found in binders, were scanned and inserted into the appropriate file on disk. If the file was not found in either location, a note was created and inserted into the corresponding area in either binder or on disk, indicating "file not found" or "cancelled due to snow". A master list of all those files has been inserted in these minutes as appendix A. Please note, all files from the years September 2005 through August 2009 are complete.

- TD Bank has changed the procedure for updating signatures for checking accounts and CD's. The new officer must go to the bank, accompanied by another authorized signer and show proper identification, as well as be fingerprinted. New rules.
- Ad rates for the newsletter MUST be published in the newsletter – how about the website too?

Committee Reports

Advertising/Publicity: Mike Mattozzi researched the ad rates for other options in the Nashua Telegraph, such as the post-it note on the front page and printed insert. The costs for both of these is prohibitive and way beyond our ad budget.

Annual Show: Jean Hallstone reported the following progress:

The postcard is here! And it looks great. We cut the order back down to 10,000 this year which freed up about \$250.00 more for print ads. Also, we used Hippo Printing, a local printer instead of the New York vendor we've used in the past, saving about \$36.00

Auction: Good news! We pulled in about \$400.00 dollars over our projection of \$3,000.00 dollars this year.
