As we approach Easter Sunday, (April 8), I find myself marveling at the enormity and scope of God’s love – for me, for us at the Lansdowne Church, and for the whole world! It really is amazing that God loves each of us as if we were the only one in the world to love; yet God also loves ALL of us, even (especially!) those whom we find hard to love! That’s a lot of what Easter is about!

In looking for resources for the April Wednesday morning Bible Study, I came across what is on the front cover of your CHIMES – 15 million images of God! Isn’t it amazing that EACH of us views the SAME God in different ways....and we’re all “right” (or “all right”) in that view?!

Have you ever thought about what you call God? What’s your favorite noun or adjective? “All powerful” means one thing; “all loving” another. Of course they’re not mutually exclusive, but what our emphasis is reflects how we feel about and relate to God! If I relate to Jesus primarily as “friend,” it will be a different relationship than if I think of Him primarily as “King.”

What is your favorite name for God? During this Easter month, I hope you’ll spend a few minutes thinking about that....and what it means? Even more, I hope you’ll explore some of these fifteen million images of God. Maybe you’ll even decide to join our Wednesday morning Bible Study (10:00 a.m. in the Garrett Room) and further examine some of the names and images from the Bible and thus from our Presbyterian Creeds and confessions.

Even more importantly, Easter season is the perfect time to reflect on God’s ENORMOUS love for you...what that love cost God...and how we respond to it! The GOOD NEWS of the Resurrection reminds us of that love – love that NEVER lets go of us during this life and the one to come. Jesus is risen! He is risen indeed!! And that is just one way God shows remarkable love for us! Thanks be to God!

Plan to join us for ALL the Holy Week services. Plan to think of who God is and what God means in your life this Easter Season. Have a blessed and love-filled Easter!

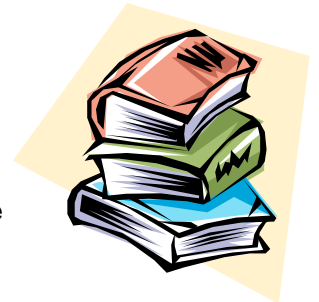

On March 11th Linda MacAlister announced to you, through a Minute for Mission, that our Summer Bulb Sale has begun.

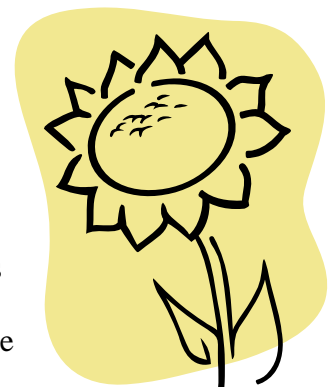

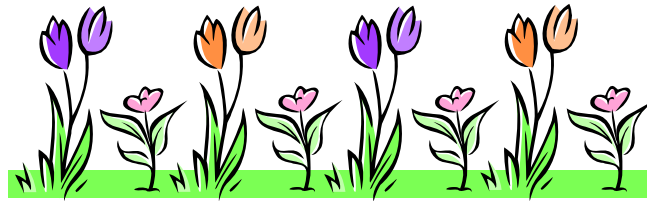

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

SUNDAY MORNINGS IN APRIL

9:00 A.M. in the Garrett Room

Throughout April the 9:00 am Adult Sunday School Class will continue its study *Through the Bible* with our seminarian Karen King. We plan to learn about the Apocryphal books on April 1st and on April 8th study what took place in the 400 year period between the end of the Old Testament and the beginning of the New Testament. We'll learn about Pharisees and Sadducees, Scribes and the Sanhedrin – all groups of people who are mentioned in the New Testament and that Jesus confronted, but we probably never really studied who they are.

On April 15th we'll start our journey through the New Testament by studying the Gospel of Matthew. We'll discover that Matthew records many of the prophecies we read about in our recent studies of the Old Testament books and tells us how they are fulfilled through Jesus. We'll study Mark on April 22nd. Mark is a book of action, and we'll see the many works that Jesus did, and look at the change from Jesus' service to his sacrifice – His death, resurrection and ascension. As we study Luke on April 29th, we'll learn many of the ways that Luke is different from Matthew and Mark, even though it is an account of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, just like the other Gospels.



This month of study will be very informative and interesting, and everyone is welcome to join us, even if you haven't been a regular part of the study. It's the kind of study that you can enjoy even jumping in on any Sunday.

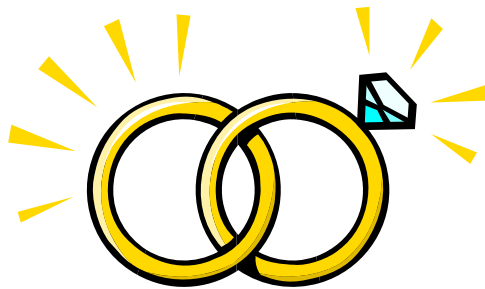
