<i>Homework Rubric</i>	
Exceeds √++ (100 A)	Work is of exceptional quality: Assignment is completed thoroughly with obvious effort and reflection
Meets √+ (90 A)	Work is done of good quality: Complete but may lack the insight, depth, or thoroughness of an “exceeds” assignment
Partially Meets √ (83 B)	Work not entirely complete – one or two answers incorrect and/or missing.
Does not meet √- (76 C)	Work not entirely complete – three or four answers incorrect and/or missing.
Unsatisfactory √-- (70 D)	Work not entirely complete – 50% of answers incorrect and/or missing
Unacceptable. Inc. (0 F)	Work not done or not handed in.

<i>Journal Rubric</i>	
Exceeds √++ (100 A)	Work is of exceptional quality: <i>All</i> Objectives and Do Now question are included. Work is neat and is dated.
Meets √+ (90 A)	Work is done of good quality: Great effort. Missing one or two entries. Work is neat and dated
Partially Meets √ (83 B)	Work not entirely complete – three or four entries missing. Some dates missing but neat
Does not meet √- (76 C)	Work not entirely complete – four or five entries missing. Pages are missing dates poor organization and lack of neatness
Unsatisfactory √-- (70 D)	Work not entirely complete – 50% of entries missing. Not dated with poor organization and lack of neatness
Unacceptable. Inc. (0 F)	Work not done or not handed in.

Complete heading with lab title and lesson/inquiry number (10 points)

Purpose: In the form of a question. What do you want to learn? (5 points)

Hypothesis: Include some background information and your hypothesis (15 points)

Materials: Include all materials you will use for the lab (10 points)

Procedures: List all the steps in your lab. Be specific. (15 points)

Data Table/Observations: Record your observations and collect data (15 points)

Conclusion: What happened? Was it what you expected? Was your hypothesis correct? (20 points)
