

1. Bookmark the following website on your computer:

This is my home page. It contains homework assignments, worksheets that you can download and print out at home, test and quiz announcements, extra help schedule, guides on how to study mathematics, notes, links, and other valuable information.

2. In about a week you will be receiving a five or six character personal identification number (PIN) made up from totally random numbers and letters (example: 6AE57). This PIN will allow you (and your parents!) to view all your test and quiz scores for an entire term plus your current average and letter grade (based only on those test and quiz scores). You can access this feature by going to my website, clicking on **Your Grade**, entering your PIN, and then using the mouse to click on **submit**. *Please note than pressing **enter** or **return** will not work. You must use your mouse and click on **submit**.*
3. Add the following address to your computer's email address book:

I check this address at least twice every day. Both you and your parents should use this email address to communicate with me outside of school. The standard school email system is very slow and often down. Please tell your parents that calling on the phone is the *LEAST* effective way to contact me. You should get into the habit of checking your own email at least once a day. Sometimes I send out group emails to my classes with valuable information.

4. I am frequently online in the evenings. I always try to be online for at least one hour on the evening before any tests or quizzes. You may instant message me (AOL) any time I am online using my screen name:
