



# Cache County ARES Member Requirements

## 1. ARES Member Introduction:

- Cache County ARES is a American Radio Relay League Sanctioned group formed by Cache County Amateur Radio operators and the Utah Department of Homeland Security. Their role is to assist the local jurisdictions (Cities, Towns, Law Enforcement, Red Cross, Hospitals etc) with communications needs in the event of Emergencies and or Disasters.
- This Level the ARES Member is the introductory level is for those that are interested in participating with the CCARES. This is mainly to register yourself with CCARES and Utah ARES and verify that you meet the minimal Requirements.

## 2. Objectives:

- This Level is a starting point and the CCARES Board goal is to have the ARES Members advance into the higher Certification Levels as you see fit. Level 1, 2 and 3

## 3. Instructors:

- The Instruction will come from many Sources. These will all be able to be from information online or by attending the CCARES Training Meetings.

## 4. Requirements:

- You must obtain a Valid Technician or higher Amateur Radio License.
- Submit an ARES Form to the Cache County ARES Emergency Coordinator.
- Submit a RACES Form to the State RACES Director.
- Attend 2 Cache County ARES Meetings.
