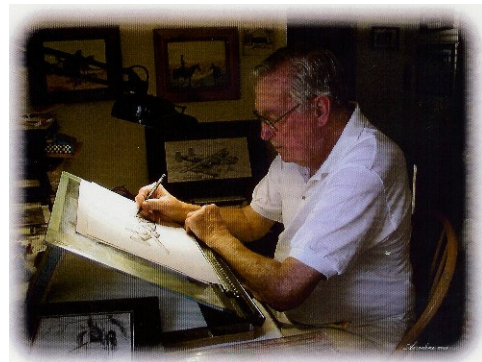
May Entertainment – Author Bill Coons

Bill Coons enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1944, just one week after his seventeenth birthday. He hoped to become a mechanic in the Navy, but at the time of enlistment, the Navy didn't need mechanics, they wanted aviation radio operators. Thus began a love affair with radios and airplanes that would ultimately shape his life forever. He earned his combat aircrewman wings in the back seat of a Navy Douglas SDB dive bomber, and was transferred to an active radio controlled target aircraft squadron (VU7-A) that provided pilotless drone aircraft to the Pacific fleet for anti-aircraft gunnery practice. He served three and a half years in the Navy and after his discharge, he became a photojournalist and worked freelance for many aviation related magazines including RC Modeler.

In 1970 he became active in amateur radio and earned his amateur extra license. Of course the next step, at age 60, was to earn his pilots license. He owned and flew the Erco Model 415-D Ercoupe for twenty years. Most of his aviation career was spent as a GPS representative for J.A. Air

Center and working with the FAA as an aviation safety counselor at the Dupage airport in West Chicago.

Bill now specializes in pen and ink aviation art and continues to write aviation safety articles.



Bill will be giving a presentation at the May meeting on his knowledge and experience on the military development and use of America's early remote controlled target aircraft.

OFFICER REPORTS

President: Mert Mischnick presided over the proceedings of the meeting.

Mert also mentioned that the run up stands that Skip Carrino put together, were now in place at the field and look great!

Vice President: Steve Dietrich said the door prize for the evening would be a mini rotary tool.

Treasurer: Bob Elsner reported on the results of the eNighter held at the dome. The eNighter event resulted in an \$880 profit to the club. The current balance is \$8784.

Secretary: Scott Taylor presented four members with All-Season flying patches after having accomplished outdoor RC flight in each of the 12 months of 2006. Those receiving patches were Scott Stampfli, Bob Babyar, Ed Wonnocott, and John Howe. Congratulations, wear your patches proudly!

Scott also handed out ballots for both the Static competition and the vote on a new logo.

COMMITTEES

Fun-Fly: Ron Hilger reported on the Dome Fun Fly. It was also mentioned that the dome would be half price for the last two weeks of the season (in April).

Safety: A motion was made to purchase a large AMA windsock. This would be an 11-inch diameter and 64 inch long version. Some concern was raised about possible confusion to pilots approaching Dupage Airport. Mert said he would check with the AMA to determine if this was an issue.

GENERAL BUSINESS

New Life Member: Scott Taylor announced that the Board has approved the designation of **Ron Hilger** as a Suburban RC Barnstormers Life Member. Their efforts were helped by the mustard seed necklaces donated by Ron Hilger that were given away with the purchase of 5 or more tickets. The 50/50 raffle we ran this year netted us and the winner \$423. We will be looking for feedback on whether to use this type of raffle again next year.

At the last Board meeting, it was decided to split the ARF category in two, since participation in this category was high last year.
