## He Does It For the Screaming Groupies CD Review: *Live*, Andrew Kerr

Never let it be said that Andrew Kerr takes himself too seriously. From the very first song on his new live CD, it's evident that he approaches his music and his life with good humor and a healthy dose of self-deprecation.

"Rock Star," the first track on *Live*, details his glamorous life as a folk singer, performing in food courts and bookstores for sparse audiences of restless children and people who'd "rather hear 'Fire and Rain.'" In the tongue-in-cheek chorus, he proclaims, "I do it 'cause you want me, I do it for the screaming groupies" – and right on cue, the audience bursts into teenybopper squeals.

Like "Rock Star," most of Kerr's songs are autobiographical. "Survivor," the song he performed as his audition for the reality television series, is a musical biography, relating his travels all over the world and his former lives as an investment advisor and an aspiring teenage rap star.

"Special K" focuses on his rap music dreams: the days when he "was in touch with his roots" and "young, gifted and black" – or at least the days before he realized that he was "skinny, white, and out of touch." The audience sings along on the refrain, until Kerr leaves them in the dust, quoting the Sugar Hill Gang's "Rappers Delight" and Public Enemy's "Bring The Noise." "I feel like there was a breakdown in communication there," he laughs as the folkies fall silent.

In "Happy Life," he again pokes fun at his musical aspirations, this time singing about the songwriter's block that can accompany

happiness. He tries to "[construct] false memories of suffering and pain," but ultimately he's happier living with his dog, his cat, and his "well-adjusted wife," even if it "don't make much of a song."

Kerr is more than just a funny songwriter. "So Much Love" and "Who Were You?" are poignant character studies, while "Ain't It Strange" is a wistful song about adjusting to a cross-country move and making a home in a new city. He performs on guitar and piano, and (as he demonstrates in "Happy Life") can also execute a mean whistle solo.

But it's Andrew Kerr's humor that most engages the audience. He skewers the seductive music of Barry White with the over-the-top "Rub You Down," and on an unlisted track, he performs Air Supply's power ballad "Making Love Out Of Nothing At All," complete with sarcastic commentary. A highlight of the CD is "Don't Forget Your Fans," a song about accidentally receiving a piece of fan mail meant for Britney Spears. Of course, Kerr makes plenty of jokes about the pop princess, from her relationship with Justin Timberlake to her insipid song lyrics, but he also confesses that he'd like to achieve her fame someday, even if it would mean being stalked by fourth grade girls.

*Live* is an excellent introduction to an artist with such infectious energy, and listeners will find themselves as engaged in the performance as the live audience members seem to be. Andrew Kerr may never be as well-known as Britney Spears, James Taylor, or even Vanilla Ice, but it's clear from this recording that he is well on his way to living out the life of a folk star.
