Dear Parents of Prospective Sounds of South Members:

We are delighted that your son or daughter is interested in auditioning for Sounds of South! SOS is a nationally honored choir under the direction of Gwen Witten Upchurch, with a 50+ year tradition of excellence at Bloomington High School South. However, Sounds of South is much more than a high school choir class, it is a group of talented and highly motivated students, who along with their parents, are committed to the success of the group.

Auditions will be held after school on March 9 starting at 2:30 p.m. If that time will not work for you due to prior commitments, contact Ms. Witten Upchurch to schedule an audition during the school day on March 10 or 11. Jackson Creek students will audition at the middle school during their choir class on March 10. The list of new Sounds of South members for the 2009–2010 school year will be posted on March 13 at 2:30 p.m. If your student is selected, there will be a **mandatory new member and parent meeting on Thursday, March 26 at 7:00 p.m.** in the choir room.

Sounds of South is a performance-oriented choir and there are certain commitments of time and money of which you and your student should be aware.

Rehearsals and Performances

Sounds of South is a class that students attend during the school day for all three trimesters. Most rehearsing takes place during that time; however, members are required to attend rehearsals and performances outside of the school day. A detailed schedule listing all performances and rehearsals is published at the beginning of each school year. Extra rehearsals not listed on the schedule are rare and will be announced well in advance. (General information is provided at right.)

SOS members participate in a wide variety of activities in addition to their academic work and Sounds of South, including sports teams, student council, cheerleading, Science Olympiad, National Honor Society, and others. Competitions and Travel

Sounds of South members participate in ISSMA solo and ensemble. All members are assigned to at least one large ensemble and many choose to perform a solo. SOS also participates in ISSMA choir competition in the Spring. Sounds of South also takes a trip in the Spring where they usually participate in an invitational festival and/or competition. In past years, we have traveled to New York City, Montreal, St. Louis, Washington D.C., Myrtle Beach, Orlando, Chicago, and Gatlinburg.

Finances

The financial support we raise is very important to the success of Sounds of South! While the MCCSC provides funds for class room instruction, Sounds of South as an organization must cover its operating expenses including Chris Miller's salary for his work as an accompanist and stage director throughout the year, SOS formal attire, the Spring trip, and costs associated with our fall musical. We have established three streams of income to cover these expenses: membership fees, our program book fundraiser, and musical ticket sales. Each of these funds is maintained and accounted for separately to cover designated expenses.

Membership fees cover SOS general operating expenses. Need-based scholarships toward membership fees are available and are made possible by generous donations from the community. If you need financial assistance with membership fees, please contact our treasurer Don Seader at 824-9897. *No student will ever be excluded for financial reasons.*

The program book fundraiser covers the group's travel expenses and other expenditures from time to time as approved by the Board. We are very proud of this book, which not only contains advertisements, but showcases the group's accomplishments, provides formal and informal photographs of the members, and honors our graduating seniors. All SOS members, including those on need-based scholarship, are expected to solicit the specified amount in ads and donations each year.

Parent Involvement

This group is not just for students. We encourage all of our member's parents to get involved by serving on one or more of our committees. It's a great way to be involved in your student's life and your help is crucial to our continued success.

Costs for SOS Members

Membership Fees for 2009-2010

\$450. Payment plans and need-based scholarships are available and will be discussed at the new member/parent meeting.

SOS Attire

No cost to students for formal attire; except shoes. Guys need black dress shoes; ladies need tan character shoes. Black SOS hoodie will be provided at no cost.

Musical Costume

Students are responsible for their own costumes, unless instructed otherwise. This can run from a few dollars to \$100 or more depending on the show and character.

Solo & Ensemble Fees

Varies depending on the number of ensembles or solos in which student participates. Ranges from \$6 to \$12 per event.

Spring Trip

No cost to students. Only money for incidentals and some meals will be needed.
