

## FIGHTING MALARIA

A third aspect added to our Wellness Program this year concerns malaria fight. 200 hundred people in Pecc Maxa, a village located 120 km south of Dakar, are sleeping in mosquito nets since Tuesday, August 8, 2006. This has been possible thanks to another grant of 5000\$ received from GBGM this year. Malaria is the first killing disease in Africa. It kills more people than AIDS. That's why fighting malaria is one of our priorities of this year. Other efforts of fighting malaria include pouring petrol in stagnant waters surrounding villages and spraying in houses at night. These two operations will be done on a weekly basis.

Mboulane Diouf and her daughter Adama Sene live in Pecc Maxa. They too received mosquito nets. Prior to that, Mboulane benefited several medical services from our team that saved her life a little while ago. Mboulane was an animist until that Tuesday, August 8. Receiving freely her mosquito net she said: "Because you people show so much love to us villagers, it means that the one who sends you has an endless love. I want to experiment that love too." Mboulane and her daughter gave their lives to Christ that day. Praise the Lord!
