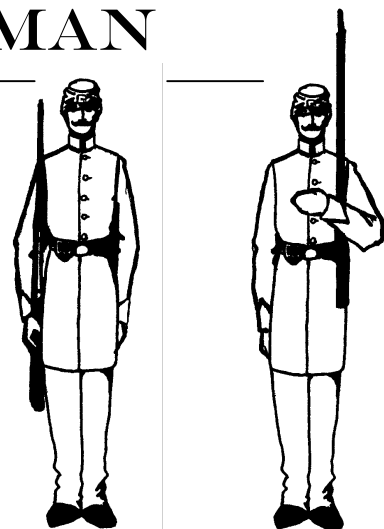


# VISUAL GUIDE TO SENTRY AND GUARD DUTIES FOR THE ENLISTED MAN

While on sentry or guard duty, the soldier will remain silently watchful at his post or along his beat until relieved. Inquiring spectators should always be treated politely, but effort should be made to refer them to other persons or parts of the camp for any involved conversation. Either shoulder arms or support arms should be maintained at all times, unless respects are to be given as follows below. SEE 1—2 BELOW

A sentry on guard will pay the following respects to officers and armed bodies of men that may pass to their front from reveille to retreat {roughly sun-up to sun-down unless ordered otherwise.} SEE 3 BELOW

## 1} Officers of rank—above the rank of Captain

Sentry or guard will **PRESENT ARMS**

## 1a} The President of the United States

The President of the United States, being the Commander in Chief, shall receive the salute of **PRESENT ARMS**.

{Additionally, any government or similarly honored dignitary may be so saluted solely at the request of the Colonel.}



## 2} Lieutenants & Captains

Sentry or guard will **SHOULDER ARMS**



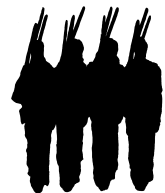
### WHO'S WHO by the STRAP?

Officers of Rank = Leaves, Birds, and Stars  
{PRESENT ARMS}

Lieutenants and Captains = Blanks or Bars  
{SHOULDER ARMS}

## 3} Men passing in formation under arms

A— If under the command of any **Officer:**  
Sentry will **PRESENT ARMS**



B— If under the command of an **NCO:**  
Sentry will **SHOULDER ARMS**
