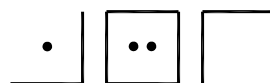


The Civil War Code

Prisoners during the American Civil War used a cipher to send secret messages.
Here's the key:

ABC	DEF	GHI
JKL	MNO	PQR
STU	VWX	YZ

To encipher a letter, draw the shape of the box it is in. Then put dots in the box you drew to show the position of the letter in the box. Each box has two or three letters. In position 1 is the first letter; in position 2, the second; and in position 3, the third. Use no dots for the letters in position 1, one dot for letters in position two, and two dots for letters in position 3. For example, the letters "B," "O," and "Y" would be written like this:



After you figure this one out, write a message of your own on the back.
